Certified Office Practicum is marketed primarily to Primary Care Pediatrics (ambulatory setting). All aspects of the Real World Testing Plan Results are from the Primary Care Pediatrics setting.

Changes To 2022 RWT Plan

The 2022 RWT Plan that was submitted to ONC & ACB in 2021, included a plan to recruit and provide metrics for 5 practices. Instead we tested the certified criteria to produce a real world testing report leveraging 9 practices as part of our early adopter program. Report results included all practices metrics for rew criteria and other criteria includes results for 2 practices. Also, the plan was for version 20 that has been 2015 edition certified. In December 2022 OP successfully completed ONC Cures Update certification and updated version to 21 (details listed in this document).

Electronic Prescribing functionality is used by OP practices to send prescription requests to the pharmacy and receive renewal requests and more.

Key Findings and Analysis:

Electronic Prescribing is a widely used functionality across our customer base. By using this functionality our practices were successfully able to create, send and receive prescriptions. Our RWT results and Interactive Testing reveals that the EHR functionality is working as expected. The EHR module conforms to the NCPDP standard 2017071.

Our analysis also revealed that CancelRx, ChangeRx functionality is not widely adopted.

Action taken on key findings:

In 2023, OP will also analyze other message types and additional statuses including failed messages.

Area of improvement:

No notable changes were made from the results. Outside functionality an area of improvement across the customer base may be to bring awareness of the additional message types to leverage electronic exchange between provider and pharmacy.

Reporting Results Time Frame: Q42022

Testing Methodology: Logging, Reporting, Interactive Testing

Interactive Testing: Every quarter and for every major release throughout Y2022, OP early adopter program practices ran through various tests to validate the functionality and for OP to address any issues that arise before the release goes to general availability.

Testing Results:

As a Pediatric specific setting this functionality is very critical for our practice base and by utilizing our Immunization Integration Program certified EHR OP users were successfully able to submit immunizations to the state registries.

Key Findings and Analysis:

Electronic submission and querying registry is a widely used functionality with OP customer base. Practices were successfully able to exchange data with the respective state immunization registry.

Action taken on key findings:

In a few cases where practice didn't capture certain data elements, OP was able to successfully requeue the date in a timely manner to exchange data with the state registry.

Area of improvement:

OP has improved the functionality for the end user to be able to view the entirety of the status message from the registry including the raw HL7 message for troubleshooting purposes. This allows OP practice staff and OP support personnel to review the message and work with the registry to improve data exchange.



RWT Criteria #3&4 Transitions of Care & Clinical information reconciliation and incorporation

Interactive Testing: Every quarter and for every major release throughout Y2022, OP early adopter program practices ran through various tests to validate the functionality and for OP to address any issues that arise before the release goes to general availability.

Testing Results:

CDA documents were received via edge protocol into OP to the addressed recipient. OP users were also successfully sending CDA documents from within OP to various direct address recipients and third party systems like HIEs and health groups.

Key Findings and Analysis:

In our analysis we identified one issue as part of Q32022 testing. Incoming direct message attachments, mainly XDM/XDR packages were failing to open. Our overall results were our EHR Transition of Care functionality is working as expected per the certification requirements.

Action taken on key findings:

After OP discovered the issue, OP has addressed the issue, and provided the fix to the issue in the release OP did in September 2022.

Area of improvement:

As part of the analysis and with our findings, we have added automated test scripts to our regression suite to identify any issues that need to be addressed internally before functionality is released to all OP customers. This has been added on top of regular functional testing that is performed including testing with our early adopter program customers.

Testing Methodology: Logging, Reporting, Interactive Testing

Interactive Testing: Every quarter and for every major release throughout Y2022, OP early adopter program practices ran through various tests to validate the functionality and for OP to address any issues that arise before the release goes to general availability.

Testing Results:

Number of Practices for Interactive Test: up to 2 practices Functional testing was conducted with two different practices for this functionality.

Key Findings and Analysis:

Our testing revealed that the user interface was not intuitive for users to set up the data export.

Action taken on key findings:

OP has introduced a new user interface that will allow the user to successfully setup the data export, and we provided training material for the users. As part of the new user interface users were also provided with an easy way to download the exported data within the EHR.

Area of improvement:

Except for the changes mentioned above, no other notable changes were made with this functionality.
